The Trinity River COMMON VISION is a regional initiative that has stimulated excitement and galvanized support for the Trinity River to be

- a SAFE Trinity River, with stabilization and reduction of flooding risks,
- a CLEAN Trinity River, with fishable and swimmable waters,
- an ENJOYABLE Trinity River, with recreational opportunities linked by a trails system within a world-class greenway,
- a NATURAL Trinity River, with preservation and restoration of riparian and cultural resources,
- a DIVERSE Trinity River, with local and regional economic, transportation and other public needs addressed.

FY2024 Trinity River Common Vision Work Program

NFIP-CDC Model Consolidation and Extension Efforts

- The USACE funded two ongoing studies related to CDC model consolidation.
 - 1. Updating the newly georeferenced CDC model with future flows and approved projects.
 - USACE and FEMA updated their models and posted consolidated NFIP-CDC model to the Trinity River CDC website.
 - Culmination of a collaborative effort to generate a first-ever consolidated NFIP/CDC model.
 - Aligns with NFIP-CDC manual updates and incorporates FMTF review & feedback.
 - Study is now complete and ongoing model maintenance is occurring.
 - 2. Creating CDC future flows for the FEMA model on the East Fork Trinity and the Trinity Mainstem to extend the consolidated NFIP-CDC model.
 - Working to develop these future flows and then extend consolidated model.
 - Anticipate sharing with FMTF for review in 2024, continued funding permitting.

- Working to have revised CDC Manual completed before next FMTF meeting.





- Revisiting conversations with Ellis County



- HydroLynx offers hardware and hardware maintenance services






