



8. TXShare Street Sweeping Update


SCA contract services:

- 37%-40% of total sales are to DOTs, counties, municipalities
- Services include: street sweeping, power washing, parking lot sweeping, catch basin cleaning, pipe cleaning, TV pipe inspection, porter services, litter pickup
- Proprietary portal allows customers to confirm that contracted segments of parking lots, roads, highways have been swept
- Equipment includes M6 Avalanche (mechanical sweeper), Elgin Broom Bear (mechanical broom sweeper), Nitehawk Sweepers (regenerative air sweeper for parking decks/garages), Model 900 Eco Combination Sewer Cleaner truck, Cues Pre-Built Lateral and Mainline and Lateral Inspection Vehicles
