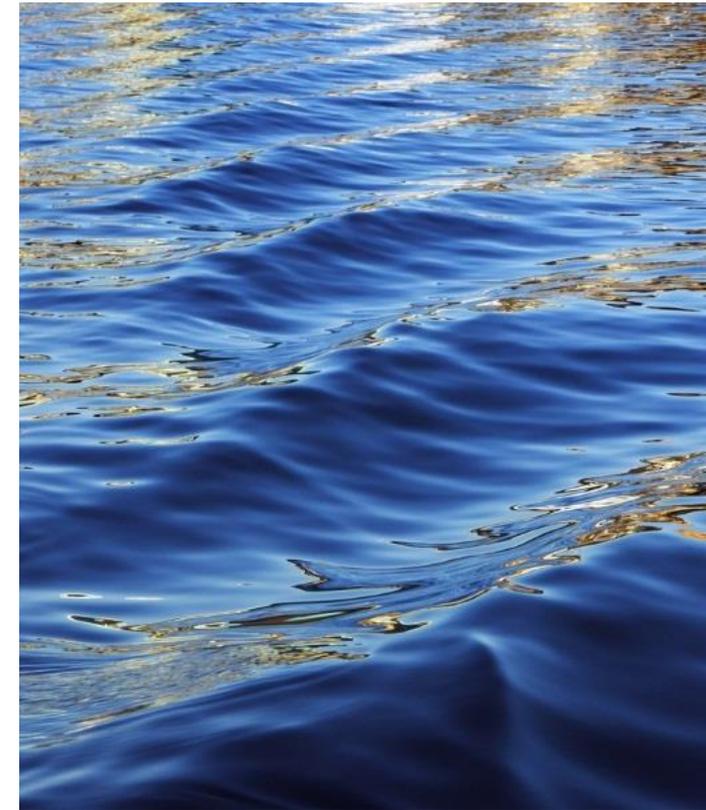

Meadows Foundation Grant Application Update

August 2021 – NCTCOG submitted an application to the Meadows Foundation for a \$200,000 grant for FY22-24, to support expanding the RISE Coalition and its programs.

January 2022 – The Meadows Foundation was scheduled to discuss our grant application at their Board meeting earlier this month. We anticipate a response with a final decision within the next few weeks.

Task 2. Regional Greenhouse Gas Emissions Project

Regional GHG Inventory

- Contracting with Local Governments for Sustainability (ICLEI), formally known as the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives, thanks to generous contribution from Burlington-Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) railroad
- NCTCOG continuing data collection related to Energy, Transportation, Waste, Water, and Wastewater for region and cohort participants

Update on Regional Tree Cooperative Concept

- Proposed NCTCOG managed Tree Cooperative Purchase Program
 - Would be open to local governments in the region (possibly out of region)
 - Coop Program likely set-up as a “catalogue discount” or “list less” option
- Could have two phases:
 - **Replacement Program:** source trees **now** to replace damaged stock (local govt. owned/managed properties)
 - **Planting Program:** source trees for local govt. use and/or residential giveaway programs in years thereafter
- Next steps:
 - Gather program commitments from local governments
 - Replacement Program: Identify how many trees (of each type) are needed now
 - Planting Program: Identify how many trees (of each type) would be needed each year after
 - Establish Focus Group to identify which tree species and sizes should be specified in RFP
 - Issue RFP by summer 2022

EPA-Funded Organic Waste to Fuel Feasibility Study

- Regional study to evaluate the potential for expanding organic waste-to-energy technologies in North Texas
- Funded through a grant from the Environmental Protection Agency, in partnership with the University of Texas at Arlington
- Regional study goals:
 - Advance regional efforts to divert food waste and other organics from landfills
 - Key organic feedstocks: residential and commercial food waste, wastewater biosolids
 - Increase regional renewable energy opportunities via renewable natural gas (RNG)
 - Evaluate the potential to reduce fleet emissions by utilizing RNG fuel
 - Identify pilot projects and partnerships to advance waste-to-energy projects, including potential sites for anaerobic digestion facilities
- **Current status:** Contractor has initiated market assessment & evaluation of available regional feedstocks, and a current vehicle inventory and consumption analysis for regional fleets



SAP Process

- Gap analysis using STAR Communities platform to gauge current policies and programs (worked in “functional groups” with directors and key personnel)
 - Consolidated results to identify opportunities to focus on in the Sustainability Action Plan
 - Council workshop to present framework and get feedback on identified focus categories
- Stakeholder feedback process


