



The Solid Waste Capacity Problem in the Western Region

Remaining landfill capacity in the Western Region is low.

Area	Remaining Landfill Capacity, 2020 (in years)
State of Texas	54
NCTCOG 16-County Region	36
Western Region	15*


^{*}Estimated time to site and construct a landfill = 15 years.



- ✓ Most of the Western Region's waste is disposed at one of four landfills.
- ✓ After Weatherford reaches capacity, the 3 remaining landfills will be located on the extreme eastern side of the Western Region.




Last Meeting of PAG on 11/16/21



Action Item - Draft By-laws

- Draft By-Laws for the Western Region Solid Waste Capacity Policy Advisory Group (PAG)
- NCTCOG will provide an overview of the draft by-laws and there will be time for questions and discussion prior to the vote.



Name and Purpose

- Defines 8-county area
- Voluntary group
- Provides a forum for:
 - 1) Collaboration on approaches, programs, or infrastructure to address landfill disposal capacity
 - 2) Identification of strategies to improve solid waste management conditions
- Encourages participation from all individuals or entities who want to advance these purposes



Membership (Voting and Non-Voting)

Voting Members

Counties

One representative from each of the 8 counties = 8

Cities/Towns

City/Town representatives within those 8 counties:

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Small cities (1500 or less) = 7 Approx. 30 in Small to medium (1501 - 7000) = 7 Approx. 30 in each of these Medium to large (7001 - 80,000) = 7 Large cities (80,000 \text{ or greater}) = 3 (3 in this group)
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(Based on NCTCOG's most recent population estimates.)



Membership

Non-voting Members

- Cities and counties not designated as voting members
- NCTCOG
- Private sector

- Environmental/public interest groups
- Those invited to provide advisory assistance



Appointment to PAG

- Submit a nomination form to the Chair
- Must be signed by Executive Officer of the representative's entity
- Non-voting members wishing to serve must notify the Chair and Vice-Chair by email or phone.



Terms

- 2-years for members and officers. Terms are staggered.
- Terms run from October 1 September 30 of second year.
- May be re-appointed.

Vacancy

- Replacement may be appointed from within the vacated member's organization within 3 months and serve out the remainder of the term.
- Otherwise, the PAG shall recommend a replacement.



Designated Alternates

- All members shall name an alternate within two months of the start of his/her term.
- If a member is unable to attend a meeting, the alternate shall attend in his/her place.

Attendance

- Expected to attend or send alternate in your stead
- Attendance is considered during reappointment

Officers

- Chair Develop meeting agendas, preside at meetings, speak at outside events to promote awareness of PAG
- Vice-Chair Develop agendas, perform duties of Chair in his/her absence
- Secretary Provide meeting notices, track attendance, keep minutes, and distribute minutes and handouts to PAG



Appointment of Officers

- PAG members put forth candidates for a PAG vote
- Appointment/reappointment of officers occurs at the same time as membership appointment/reappointment



Vacancy in An Officer Seat

- Chair If the Chair is no longer able to serve, the Vice-Chair will serve until the PAG nominates a new Chair for PAG approval.
- Vice-Chair and Secretary If one of these positions is vacant, the PAG will seek nominations for PAG approval.
- Procedure established if all officers are simultaneously unable to serve



PAG Meetings

- Open to public and held at least quarterly at time and place determined by the PAG
- Secretary provides notice of meetings by email or phone and agendas
- Special/emergency meetings may be called by the Chair and Vice-Chair, or by a majority of the PAG. Notice for these meetings must be provided at least 3 days in advance by the Secretary
- Business may be conducted electronically
- Robert's Rules of Order shall govern conduct
- Members shall maintain objectivity and professionalism (Officers are to address any incidents involving unprofessional conduct)



Quorum

- 6 or more PAG voting members
- Approving a motion requires a majority vote of PAG members present at which quorum is established

Recommendations to NCTCOG's Executive Board

 Requires a quorum and a positive vote of two-thirds of the PAG members present.



Conflicts of Interest

- PAG voting and non-voting members must disclose a conflict of interest to the PAG when a vote is called for and must refrain from discussion and recuse themselves from the vote.
- PAG members shall take all steps to avoid the appearance of impropriety in the conduct of affairs on behalf of the PAG.



Subcommittees

- Ad Hoc and standing subcommittees shall be established by the PAG as needed.
- Standing subcommittees are established and abolished by a quorum and two-thirds vote of the PAG.



Funding Commitment

 Funding commitments to support the PAG's expenses, projects, or studies, shall be discussed and approved by the PAG in the future as needed.

Miscellaneous Provisions

A proposal to alter, amend, or repeal the by-laws requires a majority vote of the PAG. However, a quorum and two-thirds vote is required for any such proposal to be effective.



Acceptance of Gifts

 No PAG officer of member shall accept any gift or benefit as consideration for any decision on behalf of the PAG

Code of Ethics

- PAG officers and members shall conduct themselves in a manner that is consistent with sound business and ethical standards
- Always consider the public interest and sound solid waste management practices
- Manage PAG affairs fairly
