

- One of 35 in the nation

Trinity River National Water Trail

- 130 miles with 21 official launch sites
- Traverses 9 municipalities including Dallas and Fort Worth and as far north as Lewisville
- All but two sections are 4-6 miles in length, one section is 12 miles and one is 24 miles

Trail Status August 2024

Currently 20 of 21 launch sites are open

- Loop 12 closed due to flood damage and safety concerns – Trinity Coalition proposed to DWU and Dallas Parks Dept to make it a take-out only site
- River Legacy is slowing deteriorating

2 drownings occurred this year (1 on the Clear Fork and 1 on the West Fork) – also 2 on the East Fork (not part of the TRNWT)

Trail Usage August 2024

- Heavy spring rains have mostly closed the Elm Fork and Main Branch (March 8 – August 8)
- River flow <3,000 CFS 4 times, only for a couple of days each time
- Downed tree between Hebron Parkway and McInnish Park washed downsteam
- Clear Fork and West Fork mostly remained open








Planned Launch Sites
