



Selected Bike and Pedestrian Count Sites




Monthly Trail Usage (Percent Change 2019 vs 2020)





Full Week Trail Volumes by Location (Percent Change May 2019 vs May 2020)





Daily Average Trail Volumes (May 2019 vs May 2020)






Day of Week (Percent Change May 2019 vs May 2020)





Mode Share (May 2019 vs May 2020)






Hourly Profile (Percent Change May 2019 vs May 2020)
