## **FY 2012 Components**

- iSWM Program

## **iSWM Program Implementation & Training**

- Assist local governments in adopting iSWM
  - Create educational forums and materials for local government staff and officials
  - Expand iSWM Tools to incorporate brochures and design examples for local government staff as well as other design professionals
- Offer formal iSWM training classes
  - Develop template presentations for all levels of government staff and officials that can be given by NCTCOG or local government staff
  - Develop and offer iSWM training classes
- Track emerging federal and state stormwater requirements for addressing construction and post-construction

## **Sustainable Public Rights of Way**

- Continue Sustainable Public Rights of Way (SPROW) Committee as a quarterly Task Force
- Maintain online resource center
- Within available resources, pursue:
  - Connectivity facilitation
  - Educational series
  - Economic implications research
  - Examine expansion into new topics

## **Public Works Construction Standards Update**

- Create a subcommittee to lead construction standards update effort
- Identify priority topics for changes to Standards through subcommittee
- Develop proposal, including costs, to update Standards over a two year period

## **Hydrologic/Flooding Technical Assistance**

- Assist FEMA RiskMAP update activities
- FEMA CTP (Cooperative Technical Partner) activities including outreach, training and general support of FEMA NFIP and mapping activities

## **General Public Works Support**

- Administratively support committees, including Public Works Council and subcommittees
- 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Public Works Roundup in Spring 2012
- Technical Assistance
- Maintain web sites – iSWM, SPROW, PW Standards
- Make Presentations to various groups on iSWM, Sustainable Public Rights of Way, Public Works Standards, etc.
